

Football Bulldogs still perfect

Sir Winston Churchill pounded Ridley College 43-6 Saturday to push its Varsity 1 football record to 4-0.

“We played a good game (and) came out with intensity, which was an improvement over last week,” Bulldogs coach Peter Perrons said. “We made some minor lapses and had too many penalties again, which we will have to improve upon.”

The victory sets up a battle of unbeaten teams — the Bulldogs host the Beamsville Bucs Thursday at 3 p.m.

Saturday’s game got off to a good start for Ridley College (0-4) when the Tigers stopped the Bulldogs on their first possession. But Ridley fumbled the return of a missed field goal and kicker Jaeger Perna recovered the ball in the end zone for a 6-0 lead.

Churchill built the lead to 34-0 at halftime on one- and three-yard TD runs by Ryan Saunders, a six-yard run by Devon Miller and a 38-yard TD pass from Andrew Krzeczowski to Andrew Dunlop. Mitch Flett had a second-quarter interception for the Bulldogs.

A safety in the third quarter made it 36-0 Bulldogs before Ridley scored on a 30-yard pass in the fourth quarter. Marc Plamondon scored on a four-yard run for Churchill to make the final score 43-6.
